A nonregistering party seeking to contest the validity or enforcement of a registered order in this state must request a hearing no later than twenty days after the date of mailing or personal service of the notice of the registration by filing a motion with this court. A motion contesting the validity or enforcement of a registered order should be filed with the Franklin County Clerk of Courts, Juvenile Division, 373 South High Street, 4th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

A nonregistering party may seek to vacate the registration, to assert any defense to an allegation of noncompliance with the registered order, or to contest the remedies being sought or the amount of any alleged arrearages pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 3115.607. If the nonregistering party fails to request a hearing in a timely manner, the order is confirmed by operation of law. If the nonregistering party makes a timely request for a hearing, this court will conduct a hearing to determine whether the registered order should be confirmed.
