Each party listed herein Mother/Father Other _____ shall submit to a hair follicle or urine drug test within 24 hours of a request by the Family Assessment investigator at American Court Services, 326 S. High Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, (740) 687-6156. Each party Mother/Father Other _____ shall pay the cost of the test and shall release his or her test results to the Family Assessment Department. Any drug screen request made by the Family Assessment investigator pursuant to this provision is in addition to any other orders made by the Court regarding drug or alcohol testing, unless otherwise noted herein.

Upon presentation of a copy of this order, the Family Assessment investigator assigned to this case shall be granted reasonable access to the child at school or in placement without obtaining the consent of the child's parent, guardian or custodian. The child(ren) currently attend(s) _____

school(s).

The investigator shall also be permitted to consult with any teachers, administrators, counselors or other staff regarding the child or children who are the subject of the investigation in this case without the necessity of written consent of the parent(s), guardian(s) or custodian(s).

Upon presentation of a copy of this court order, issued in compliance with 45 C.F.R. 164.512, to any agency, hospital, organization, school, person, or office including but not limited to the Clerk of Court, human services agencies, public children services agencies, private child placing agencies, pediatricians, psychiatrists, other physicians, psychologists, counselors, or law enforcement agencies, the Family Assessment Investigator shall be permitted to inspect and copy any records regarding the child(ren), including treatment for physical and mental illness, and/or drug abuse, and/or AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome), and/or the results of an HIV test or the fact that an HIV test was performed, relating to the child(ren) without the consent of the child(ren) or the child's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), and to discuss with the person providing the treatment or tests in issue all matters pertinent to treatment and findings related to the child(ren). At the conclusion of the case, the Family Assessment Investigator shall maintain the confidentiality of records received pursuant to this order.

OTHER ORDERS: _____
